

CLUB HISTORY

Founded in 2003, our primary ambition starting out was to provide basketball opportunities for young people in Birmingham.

In the time since, we have embarked upon an incredible journey that has seen us work with thousands of young people – playing our part in their progression and development both on and off the court.

We now operate a Performance Programme consisting of 15 teams and 150 members alongside a Community Programme which provides coaching to over 750 young people across the city.

We formed a Senior Men's team in 2014 to provide a seamless transition into the senior game for our junior players and the incredible redevelopment at Nechells Wellbeing Centre will undoubtedly benefit our junior and senior teams alike as we continue to develop as a club.

In 2016 NBA Legend Hakeem Olajuwon joined us and has since helped us to activate our International Summer Camp Programme and raise the profile of our Academy Programme and our club.

Rockets Academy Programmes now provide educational partners to support 30 full-time students aged 16-19 years old whilst Rockets Camp Programmes are accessed by 250 youngsters annually, providing opportunities during school holidays to young local people in addition to others located both in the UK and overseas.







Since 2005 the club has participated in several overseas tournaments including Belgium, Sweden and Ireland, providing many young people with an international experience and exposure to a variety of cultures. Our recent partnerships formed with Spanish and Portuguese clubs further enhances these opportunities. As a forward-thinking organisation, our eyes are firmly on what is ahead of us. The renovation of Nechells Wellbeing Centre demonstrates our continual desire to grow and reach as many people as possible and we are thankful for all the support that we have received from everyone involved in the process.

This facility will provide a world-class experience for those taking part in club activities. We have big dreams and aspirations to positively impact thousands more young people as we move forward.

As well as the investment in Nechells Wellbeing Centre as a facility, the generosity of 2K Foundations will enable us to provide additional sessions, further weekly games via a 2K league, as well as supplementing with transport to the facilities for those who need it across the city.

However, we are very proud of our past and what we have achieved. From humble beginnings, thousands of success stories have emerged. Every young person that has been through our programme is a success story. To mention just a few, some are now professional basketball players, royal marines, teachers, engineers and police officers.

Whatever route their path has taken them we could not be prouder of the young people that have been involved with us. They will always be part of the COB family.

Over the last year, 2K Foundations has grown its efforts to support a number of projects, representing communities around the globe and showcasing the program's expansion, to include career and learning initiatives, expanded access to sports through golf clinics and tournaments, community enrichment opportunities through music and upgraded studios and much more. This marks one of the first 2K Foundation projects in Europe and we are incredibly grateful for their investment in our club and in the city of Birmingham.



Here at COB Rockets, we believe that we are more than a club. Part of the way we demonstrate this is through our wide range of community work and outstanding youth programmes. We deliver a variety of developmental sessions and training camps for young people. Our goal is to teach participants important fundamental life skills and improve their basketball ability whilst promoting a happy and healthy lifestyle.

We connect with the local and wider community through a range of activities. We deliver a variety of holiday camps across Birmingham and the wider region to provide opportunities for children to experience Rockets basketball in their local community.


In 2021, post-pandemic, we operated a number of camps across Birmingham. These camps provided over 200 hours of basketball to 250 young people and enabled the club to provide positive activities after a challenging eighteen months during which many young people had very little activity. Basketball is more than just a game, and we are more than just a club. Our philosophy includes helping each individual participant to realise their full potential on and off the basketball court.

Our community outreach work provides some of the most deprived and underprivileged young people in Birmingham with access to affordable or free basketball within their own community. Recent projects have included school delivery to over 650 children in 8 schools in the Nechells ward which is highlighted as one of the most deprived areas nationally. Other partnership work has resulted in the delivery of free basketball schemes across the city whilst our exciting new under 16 Central Venue League planned from October 2021 will provide competitive opportunities for young people from across the city to come together on a regular basis.

Our central Birmingham home, Nechells Wellbeing Centre, is at the heart of the city and the location is emblematic of our commitment to deliver a high-quality experience to the diverse communities of our great city. Our Rockets community of players, coaches and volunteers represent the incredible talent the city has to offer. We are proud to provide a basketball club to represent the people of Birmingham.

Foundation Basketball Coordinator Ricardo D'Alva said: "The development programme at the Rockets has progressed to become one of the biggest providers of grassroots basketball in the country.

"We are proud to be able to offer a productive outlet to a large number of young people in Birmingham and we look forward to using this fantastic centre to enhance our continued growth.




